RIDE METRO TO THE WALLIS

The GoPass Program is available to students at participating K-12 schools, with a focus on helping students ride transit without the worry of paying fare. The City of Los Angeles Charter Bus Program is designed to assist senior, youth and disabled groups in the City of Los Angeles with free or subsidized charter bus services to attend educational, recreational or cultural events in the region. Service is provided on coach, school and wheelchair accessible vehicles, and is available throughout the year on a first-come, first-served basis.
